

# Identity *(essential)*

## Character Builder

Character name

### Metadata

Author's name

Character's setting, story, or series

### Appellations: What is the character called?

Character's full name

Character's nickname(s) and alias(es), if any

Character's title(s), if any

### Origins: Of what groups is character a member?

Character's species

Character's ethnicity, race, or extraction

Character's nationality of birth or ancestry

Character's citizenship or current nationality

### Basics: What are the character's vital statistics?

Character's birthdate and age as of specified date

Character's sex and gender, if different

Character's height (meters or feet and inches)

Character's mass/weight (kilograms or pounds)

# Description *(essential)*

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## Appearance: What does the character look like?

Overall physique, face and head, torso or trunk

Limbs: arms/hands (fore), legs/feet (hind), other

## Details: What distinguishes the character?

Integument (e.g., skin, fur, feathers, scales, coloring)

Markings (e.g., birthmarks, scars, tattoos)

Eyes (e.g., color, shape) and hair (e.g., color, style)

Voice (e.g., pitch, smoothness, volume, accent)

Anatomy (e.g., unusual conditions or afflictions)

## Description (cont'd.)

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### Body Language: How does the character move?

Default facial expression (when not emoting)  
Posture, typical gestures/motions, gait (walk & run)  
Speech, overall expressiveness and animation

### Accoutrements: What does the character wear?

Clothing (e.g., formal, casual, specialized)  
Prostheses (e.g., eyeglasses, braces, artificial limbs)  
Typical equipment (if any), other details

# Personality *(essential)*

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**Weaknesses:** What are character’s negative traits?

Weakest points, traumas or scars, taboos or fears  
Regrets, lost opportunities, neuroses or psychoses  
Qualities in self, and activities, character dislikes

**Strengths:** What are character’s positive traits?

Strongest points, activities the character enjoys  
Qualities the character admires in him- or herself

# Personality (cont'd.)

## Ideals: What guides the character?

Philosophy of life, what makes life worthwhile  
What is worth dying for, what galvanizes character  
How the character sees his or her future

## Tastes: What does the character like or enjoy?

Hobbies, pastimes, and sense of humor  
In the arts (e.g., music, graphic arts, literature)  
Favorite graphic elements (e.g., colors, styles)  
Favorite fantasy (not necessarily sexual)

# Personality (cont'd.)

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**Self-image:** What does character think of self?

How the character sees him- or herself

How the character *wants* to see him- or herself

How far character is from the desired self-image

**The Present:** How will character drive the story?

What is the character's current problem?

How will it get worse?

# Biography *(recommended)*

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## Childhood: What was his or her early life like?

Birthplace (locale, city or region, nation)

Describe character as a child, outline childhood

Incidents that most affected character, how & why

## Adolescence and Adulthood

Outline the character's later life to the present

Incidents that most affected character, how & why

# Biography (cont'd.)

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## Background: What else is important?

Formal education, work experience, special skill(s)  
Proudest achievement(s) and greatest shame(s)  
Other person of greatest influence, how, and why

## Relationships: What ties to other people?

Family (nuclear & extended), clan or tribe (if any)  
Friends/acquaintances (e.g., lovers, best, contacts)  
Enemies and rivals (e.g., greatest, professional)

## Connections *(recommended)*

**Viewpoints:** How does he/she see the world?

Views on: money and wealth, ambition and power

Views on: religion and philosophy, home and travel

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**Relations:** How does he/she see personal ties?

Socialization (introverted or extroverted, details)

Views on: family and marriage, love and sex

Views on friendship and enmity

# Connections (cont'd.)

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## Looking out: How does character regard others?

Activities of, & qualities in, others character likes  
Activities of & qualities in others char. dislikes/hates

## Looking in: How do others regard him/her?

How others view, and react to, the character  
How he or she *wants* them to view and react

# The Outside View *(optional)*

## For the Author: Why is the character interesting?

Sum up the character in a line or two  
Most important thing to know about the character  
How the character differs from similar characters  
Why the character is worth writing about  
How character is memorable (a memorable character is strong in some way—saint, sinner, or both)

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## Responses: How will people react to character?

Your reaction to the character, and why  
How you believe others will react, and why
