





Poking Around has had a long and complicated history.

It began as a childish backlash to how disappointed I was with *Pokémon Sun and Moon* the video games, and subsequent anime adaptation. But the longer I worked on it, the more it evolved and became its own thing. As an organic project, it didn't really have a synopsis or game plan, or structure. If anything, it was my attempt at emulating *yonkoma-style* comics I'd seen many Southeast Asian artists produce online, though I eventually dispensed with that format. So you'll see a massive evolution over time.

Anyway, as such, Poking Around is a very personal work and is stuffed to the brim with references and responses to things that made sense at the time the pages were being produced. So this Companion Guide will serve to fill in the blanks, especially given there's a lot of bilingual or cultural aspects that won't make sense otherwise. Think of it as a glimpse into the inner workings of my mind.


To make things visually clear, I've put everything into a table format like so:

Let's begin, starting with Part 1, originally published back on 18th October 2016!



COMEL CITY	Pronounced 'cumel' (rhymes with pummel); it's a corruption of the idiom "Come one, come all".



Back when *Poking Around* first started, I put myself under a lot of pressure to produce a page every fortnight, an unrealistic goal. Tori was not even part of the original plan, I drew him in as a "placeholder" whilst I figured out what next to do via a poll I posted for readers to vote on. At the time (2016) <u>Incineroar</u> proved a popular character to draw but I personally disliked the official design and redrew it in my own way. I also had to satisfy my love of linguistics, so for a while, Tori acted as a tutor.

From the comic Contextualisation Kabukichō is a district in Shinjuku, Tokyo. Euphemistically called the 'entertainment district', it is famous for its host- and hostess-clubs, love hotels (motels where you can have sex) and nightclubs, movies and clothes. I passed through it twice when I was in Japan several years ago. When I produced this page in February 2017, the Japanese Government started trying to clean up Kabukichō's reputation ahead of the then-upcoming 2020 Olympics. Many sting operations began to end illegal activities (such as prostitution, drug peddling and interacting with minors as escorts), or play down any associations with the Japanese mafia, the Yakuza. Interestingly, *Kabukichō* is the inspiration behind the fictional Kamurochō, where the SEGA video game series, Yakuza, is set. Spoofing the anime Tamako Market and the franchise Re:Zero: Starting Life in Another World. Keijo!!! Hip Whip Girl and KizNaiver.





The light novel and anime series <u>Is It Wrong To Try And Pick</u>
<u>Up Girls in a Dungeon?</u> The lengthy original Japanese title
ダンジョンに出会いを求めるのは間違っているだろうか or *Danjon ni*<u>Deai o Motomeru no wa Machigatteiru Darō ka?</u>
is often shortened to ダンまち *DanMachi*.

Kuroki's ringtone is my very own rewrite of the Pokémon dub-opening for Pokémon: Battle Frontier, the first to be produced after 4Kids lost the Pokémon anime license in 2005, and new voice actors replaced the originals.



His phone's brand is a mash-up of the South Korean multinational tech manufacturer Samsung and the Pokémon Samurott.






Keiji's comment about his sister is in reference to Lycanroc's Midnight Forme.

Lady Ga-Garden-Noir: A portmanteau of Lady Gaga and Gardevoir.





Mudale-Onna: Mudsdale and the singer Madonna. 女 onna is woman in Japanese.
